Accident Preparedness

University of Tampa Science & Art Students are expected to conduct themselves in a professional manner at all times to minimize the occurrence of an accident. Minimally we expect you will:

- Come to class prepared and properly implement work procedures.
- 2. Stay focused and follow lab & studio rules.
- 3. Always wear the appropriate clothing and Personal Protective Equipment [PPE] assigned by Instructors.
- 4. Do not work alone.
- Familiarize yourself with the nearest exit and the route out of the building.
- Identify the location of the nearest eye wash, emergency shower, first aid kits and emergency phones.
- 7. Read the Safety Data Sheets [SDS] known formerly as Material Safety Data Sheets [MSDS] for the chemicals in use.

What to do following an accident:

- Immediately Notify your Instructor.
- 2. Evacuate Space if Chemical Accident or Fire.
- 3. Call 911 for Serious Injuries to Summon Medical Attention.
- 4. Contact Campus Security at: 813-257-7777 or Xtn. 7777
- 5. Use Available Safety
 Equipment for chemicals
 that contact body parts—
 Flush for at least 20
 minutes or until help
 arrives.
- 6. Report details of all Accidents or Near-Miss Incidents to your Instructor or Supervisor

X Never investigate or clean up a chemical spill unless you are trained
